## **Active Mobility Innovations** for Green and Safe City Solutions

Safety Improvement area: Eastern periphery of Reykjavik's city centre Problem: Car dependency, culture favouring cars, public transportation stigma, limited inclusivity, accessibility issues

Measures: Complete overhaul of the primary mobility hub (Hlemmur) coupled with its integration into a new Bus Rapid Transit line

Goals: Establish a comprehensive and safe multimodal mobility infrastructure that prioritises inclusivity and aligns with carbon-neutrality targets

Target groups: Local residents, tourists, car users, commuters, pedestrians, cyclists, scooter riders, public transport users, business owners


Stakeholders: City departments responsible for urban development, transportation, accessibility and environmental considerations; local road and transport authorities, mobility providers, tourism services, civil society

Daily car driving distance by centrality:








